








### SWACC Losses – 5 years Property F&S




### Property Frequency & Severity by Cause - 5 years combined

\$20M 100






### SWACC Losses – 5 years Liability F&S




### Liability Frequency & Severity by Cause – 5 years combined







### What SWACC Inspections are:

- Audit of your programs
- Identification of serious hazards
- Verification that known hazards are being corrected



### **SWACC** Inspections

### What SWACC Inspections are <u>not</u>:


- A replacement for your self-inspections
- Meant to find all possible hazards
- Punitive



## Controlling Hazards





### Controlling Risks

### Program-based approach

- Responsible person(s)
  - Authority & responsibility
- Include stakeholders
- Gather exposure information
- Evaluate control measure options
  - Risk Appetite
- Implement control measures
- Monitor effectiveness and adjust
  - Audit, test, correct

Locked fire exit/egress route

Liability

Remove the chain

Self inspections, training, IIPP, EOP





Asphalt in parking lot trip hazard & clogged drain

Liability & Property

Tape area off, saw cut & level walking path and clear drain

Self inspections, preventative maintenance, planning





Electrical/Fire Hazard

Property/Liability

Remove and replace by qualified electrician

Site inspections, repair/work order audits, construction job walks


